LOOKING AHEAD ~

Sunday, May 26, is the last Sunday before Summer Hours begin on June 2.

Monday, May 27, is Memorial Day; the Church Office will be closed.

Thursday, May 30, is the Day of Ascension of the Lord. Scripture tells us that Jesus appeared to his disciples for a period of 40 days after Easter, proving that he was alive after the Resurrection and giving final instructions to his followers. The Ascension is recorded at Luke 24:45-53, and Acts 1:1-11.

Sunday, June 2, begins Summer Hours at Hebron, with Sunday School at 9:00 a.m. and Morning Worship at 10:00, followed by Lemonade on the Lawn. Summer Hours are in effect June-August. June 2 is also the 7th and last Sunday of Easter, ending the Christian season of Easter.

Sunday, June 9, is the Day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit fell upon the gathered believers in Jerusalem. The story is told in Acts 2:1-21; Peter’s sermon on the Day of Pentecost is recorded at Acts 2:14-41.
