PENTECOST OFFERING – Hebron will receive the Pentecost Offering beginning on the Day of Pentecost, June 9. This offering is one of four denominational offerings in the Presbyterian Church (USA), of which Hebron is a member; the other three are: One Great Hour of Sharing, the Peace and Global Witness offering (formerly the Peacemaking Offering), and the Christmas Joy Offering (formerly the Joy Gift). Gifts to the Pentecost Offering go to help at-risk youth. Sixty percent goes to the PC (USA) for national and international distribution, while 40% of the offering remains in our community to support local programs. The Commitment/ Witness Committee has designated the recipient of the local portion of the offering to be the Shenandoah Office on Youth, which helps at-risk youth and young adults throughout our area.
