WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY is being observed today as we celebrate the Lord's Supper during morning worship, joining churches throughout the nation and the world in having Communion today. Please prepare your hearts and minds to participate in this Sacrament.

We also will receive the Peace and Global Witness Offering today (formerly the Peacemaking Offering), with 25% of the offering distributed directly by Hebron to the Shenandoah Office on Youth, which serves at-risk youth and young adults throughout our area. Fifty percent of the offering goes to the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness, and 25% goes to PCUSA mid-level councils for ministries of peace and reconciliation.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING OCT. 21 – At the request of the Church Nominating Committee, the Session has called a Congregational Meeting to be held immediately following morning worship on Sunday, Oct. 21, for the purpose of electing four elders to serve as the Class of 2021. Elders are elected to 3-year terms, and can be elected for one successive term; but in no case may anyone serve more than six consecutive years.
