VALLEY MISSION NEEDS – The Commitment/Witness Committee asks for donations to Valley Mission. **Priority Needs:** Meats (canned meats can be left in the collection boxes; if you have frozen or refrigerated meats, we can see that those get delivered promptly if you contact a member of the C/W Committee or the church office so arrangements can be made for pick-up and/or delivery), liquid laundry detergent (needed for front loading washers), window cleaner, Pine Sol or other disinfectant supplies. **Ongoing Needs:** Food Items: cereal, sugar, powdered milk, fresh fruit, coffee, creamer. Shelter Items: toilet paper, paper towels, disposable latex gloves. Resident needs: travel alarm clocks, adult underwear, adult Depends, deodorant, hair nets (for use in kitchen), caps, head scarves.

There are plastic bins in each vestibule for your non-perishable contributions. We are hoping to fill these up several times this month as you make your gifts. Thank you!
