DISASTER ASSISTANCE – Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), our denomination’s disaster response and assistance program, is receiving contributions from any who wish to contribute to help areas suffering natural disaster, including flooding along the Mississippi River, recent tornadoes throughout the U.S., and the March earthquake and tsunami in Japan. You can give through Hebron by indicating on your check or gift that you wish it to go to PDA. Please specify whether you wish to make a general gift, or name the disaster relief area you wish to support.

VOLUNTEERS AVAILABLE – Once again the Congregational Ministries reminds the congregation that volunteers are available to help transport members of Hebron to and from doctor’s appointments if there is a need. If you need this service, or if you could help with this need, please contact the church office at 885-1648.

Commitment/Witness Committee - The total contributions to **One Great Hour of Sharing** totaled \$1,137 which is divided equally between hunger and the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program. Both of these have been and are vital in meeting the tremendous needs related to the many recent weather related situations. Some of the most recent statistics are:

- April -- 875 tornadoes, a record number in April since the last record set in 1974 of 267 tornadoes.
- Disasters in some 17 presbyteries.
- Eighteen states have disaster declarations in some part of their state.
- And 7 PCUSA churches damaged with 10s of thousands of homes destroyed.

One of the major challenges with these events is making certain that every person, every family affected has access to as much assistance as possible. To do that, all need to be registered, and connected with every available relief agency. PDA is a part of the relief and recovery process. They are not the first responders, but they are an integral part of the ongoing recovery process. While other agencies come as first responders, and are gone after the initial 2-3 months, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is there for the long haul. This means years and not weeks.

Valley Mission- Priority Needs - Cleaning materials, meat (this can be canned meats of if bacon or other types we can see that those get delivered promptly if you contact a member of the C/W Committee or the church office so arrangements can be made for pick-up and/or delivery.

VALLEY MISSION NEEDS – The Commitment/Witness Committee asks for donations to Valley Mission. Food Items: cereal, sugar, powdered milk, fresh fruit, coffee, creamer; Shelter Items: laundry detergent, Pine Sol or other disinfectant supplies, toilet paper, paper towels, disposable latex gloves; Resident needs: travel alarm clocks, adult underwear, adult Depends, deodorant, hair nets (for use in kitchen), caps, head scarves. There are plastic bins in each vestibule for your non-perishable contributions. We are hoping to fill these up

several times this month as you make your gifts. As soon as they are filled we will take the items to the Mission. Thank you!
