A quorum being present, the Moderator opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. with prayer and devotions from Psalm 25:5.

Clerk's Report: Session approved minutes of the Stated Meeting of March 24, 2016. Session approved a request from Taylor McNeal to use the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, June 5, after worship until 6:00 p.m. for a Graduation Party. Clerk approved a request from Elder Noah Turnage to be removed from membership at Hebron.

Treasurer's Report: A handout was provided by Treasurer Michael Ruleman with a detailed Report of Fund Balances as of April 28, 2016. The general fund continues in the red at (-\$30,101.41). The total in our checking and savings stands at \$138,084.15.

Presbytery Matters: The next Stated Meeting of Shenandoah Presbytery will be Tuesday, May 10, at Front Royal Presbyterian Church in Front Royal, Va. David Obenschain will be the Elder Commissioner with Martha Sieck and Hannah Bush as alternates.

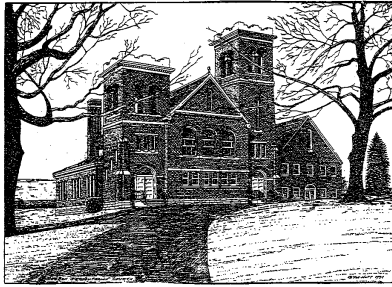

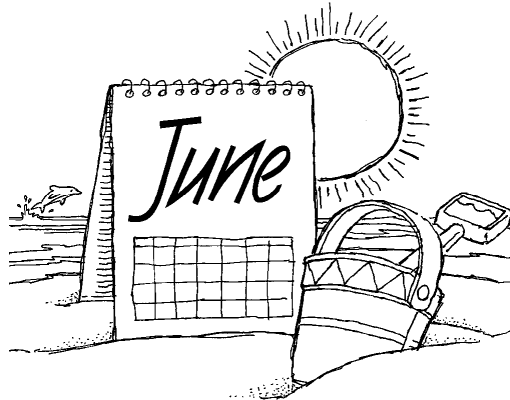
