The Session of Hebron Presbyterian Church held its stated monthly meeting on Thursday, March 24. Minutes of the meeting were approved at the April 28 Session meeting and are printed here:

A quorum being present, the Moderator opened the meeting at 7:05 pm with prayer. The Moderator presented a devotional using verses from I Kings, which reminds us to be open to hearing God in times of silence.

New Members: The Moderator invited Allen and Jeannie Martin to share their faith journey with Session, after which Session accepted them into membership through reaffirmation of faith.

Clerk's Report: Session approved the minutes of the Feb. 24, 2011, Stated Session Meeting as presented. Session approved a request from Mildred Brown for use of the Fellowship Hall and kitchen for a family event on Sunday, April 17, 2011, at around 2:30 p.m. following the church's New Members Luncheon. Session approved a request from Robin Ruleman for use of the Fellowship Hall and kitchen on Saturday and Sunday, May 14-15, 2011, for a Relay For Life fundraising luncheon. The Clerk forwarded a request from the Presbytery History Committee to the Commitment / Witness Committee. The request is for updated information on Hebron's mission support activities.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Michael Ruleman distributed a report of fund balances as of March 24, 2011, and a report of receipts and disbursements since the last meeting. For the period, General Fund expenses exceeded income by \$1027.23. The General Fund was (-\$ 6,573.02). The report was approved by Session.

Committee Reports

Christian Education (Lora Turnage, Hannah Bush, Eric Shiflet): Chair Lora Turnage distributed a report of the last committee meeting highlighting the Easter Egg Hunt on April 23, 2011, from 10 a.m. till noon, and the VBS decoration event at Covenant Presbyterian Church on May 14, 2011, from 9 a.m. until noon. Session approved a committee recommendation that Vacation Bible School (VBS) be held at Hebron the evenings of Sunday through Thursday, June 26-30, 2011. The com-



mittee recommended that Session approve the Hebron Church Youth Scholarship and presented documentation on the purpose, criteria for recipients, scholarship amount, and the process for selection of recipients. Session approved the request.

Congregational Care (Lorrie Dean, Martha Sieck): The committee distributed a report of the last meeting highlighting activities including letters to homebound, visitation, home communion scheduling, birthday telephone calls, cards to church members or families, and Homecoming activities.

Fellowship (Lorrie Dean, Robin Moyer): The committee distributed a report of the last meeting highlighting the New Member Luncheon on April 17, 2011; Lemonade on the Lawn for June 5-Aug. 28, 2011; and Homecoming activities Oct. 9, 2011.




