Even though it was a bitter cold night, approximately 55 ladies attended, plus assorted young people and men for a total crowd of about 70. We made \$1,811.50, and hope to have a higher total because a few folks still owe. We collected a large number of cans of food, with some folks bringing full bags and boxes!
