

Easter Season Lasts Until Pentecost, May 19

Easter on the Christian Calendar is not a single day, but is a season of seven weeks, lasting from Easter Sunday until the Day of Pentecost, which is May 19 this year.

Easter is one of three special seasons during the Christian Year. The other two are Advent, the season of preparation before Christmas (always the four Sundays before Dec. 25), and Lent, the season of preparation before Easter (40 days before Easter, not counting Sundays). (Technically, there is a Christmas season as well, lasting from Dec. 25 until Epiphany on Jan. 6, but that's not quite two weeks [that's also where we get "the 12 days of Christmas"]).

While Advent and Lent are about preparing for a major Christian holiday, the Easter season is for special emphasis upon the Risen Lord, how Jesus appeared to disciples after the Resurrection and before the Ascension (when he returned to heaven), and how the Church today is called to be in relationship with the living Jesus Christ.

Actually, there is one sense in which we celebrate Easter all year long, and that is that we meet for worship on Sunday. The first Christians were the Jewish disciples who had followed Jesus, and they continued to worship in the Temple in Jerusalem, according to Luke and Acts.

But in addition to worshipping on Friday night and Saturday, the Jewish Sabbath, the Jewish Christians also gathered to worship on Sunday in remembrance of the fact that Jesus rose on a Sunday. So, to this day, Christians keep Sabbath on Sunday because it was on a Sunday that Jesus was raised.

Pentecost ends the Easter season. The Greek word *pentecost* means "50th day." Pentecost is 50 days after Easter. Pentecost was also another name for the Jewish Festival of Weeks, or the Spring Harvest Festival, held 50 days after Passover.

Jesus died at Passover, so there is a connection between Easter and Pentecost, just as there was a connection between Passover and Pentecost; both were 50 days apart.

The 50 days between Easter and Pentecost should not

simply be a time without any special focus; instead, we are called to focus on our own encounters with the Risen Christ, or to remember the witness and testimony of others who have encountered our Risen Lord.

Most of us today have not had a personal *physical* encounter with Jesus, the way the first disciples did when Jesus appeared to them, or the way Jesus appeared to the Apostle Paul in a blinding light on the road to Damascus, although some people have.

But most true Christians *have* had a *spiritual* encounter with Jesus, in which we have felt the presence of God, or God's warmth, love and forgiveness given to us through Jesus.

Just as we are called to renew our faith at Christmas and Easter, we are called to renew our commitment and conviction to Jesus' resurrection during the extended Easter season.

Thursday, May 9, is *Ascension of the Lord* on the Christian Calendar. The day of Ascension is when Jesus returned to heaven after having appeared to his disciples for 40 days after the Resurrection on Easter. He ascended after 40 days, and the Holy Spirit came on Pentecost, which was 50 days after Easter.




