Easter: The Starting Point of Christianity

Although Jesus and his first disciples were all Jews, Christianity is different from Judaism because of the person and work of Jesus.

Jesus was the Christ (from which we get the word "Christ-ian"). "Christ" is a Greek word that means "anointed one"; more specifically, it is God's Anointed One. In Hebrew, the word for "God's Anointed One" is "Messiah."

So Jesus, God's Anointed One, is the Christ, and is the Messiah. And it is through Jesus that the ultimate truths about God are revealed, including God's plan for salvation, and God's love for all humanity.

Through Jesus the true nature and self-definition of God were also revealed: One God in three persons, who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – yet still one God.

So Jesus is worshiped as God, because he is God the Son; and through him God the Father and God the Holy Spirit are also revealed.

All of these truths were revealed in their fullness on Easter. Jesus had talked about the nature of God and the love of God throughout his earthly ministry, but nobody really understood it until Easter, the Day of Resurrection.

Until the crucifixion, the disciples thought Jesus was a great teacher or rabbi, and even a prophet who could perform miracles. But he was still just a human to them.

Then he died, and the disciples despaired. As two of them explained, "We had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel" (Luke 24:21a).

On Easter, Jesus rose again from the dead, and he

The Session of Hebron Presbyterian Church held its stated monthly meeting on Thursday, Jan. 24. Minutes of the meeting were approved at the Feb. 28 Session meeting and are printed here:

Elder Joann Weikert opened the meeting with prayer at 7:00 p.m. A quorum was declared present. The Moderator being absent but having given his permission, Clerk Robin Moyer was elected to serve as moderator for the meeting.

Annual Business: Elder Robin Moyer was elected Clerk of Session for 2013. Elder Michael Ruleman was elected Treasurer for 2013. All Elders updated contact information. Elders submitted committee requests. Annual Congregational Meeting was set for Feb. 10 to present 2013 Budget for information and to act on proposed changes in the Pastor's Terms of Call.

Clerk's Report: Minutes from Stated Session Meeting of Dec. 20, 2012, and Called Session Meeting of Jan. 13, 2013, were approved as presented. Session approved removal of William Tuttle, Mary Margaret Clifton and Elizabeth Croft from Active Membership Role following their deaths. The Annual Statistical Report for 2012 was approved. Session approved moving five members from active to inactive role. Committee reports are due to the church secretary by Feb. 15 for Annual Report.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Michael Ruleman presented a detailed Report of Fund Balances as of January 24, 2013 including a Budget vs. Actual Report. The general fund continues in the red at (-\$9,007.73). The total in our checking and savings accounts stands at \$72,826.09.

Presbytery Meeting: The next Presbytery Meeting is Feb. 9, at 1st Presbyterian Church in Martinsburg, WV.

I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem'" (Luke 24:44-47).

From that beginning on Easter, Christians have been those who worship Jesus as the Christ, the Messiah, God's Anointed One, who fully reveals God as the Holy Trinity, and who is himself God the Son.

As the Apostle Paul said, if all of that isn't true, then Christians are to be pitied. Paul explained in 1 Corinthians 15:14-19, "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he has raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most

to be pitied."

But then Paul says in the next verse, verse 20, "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead."

Jesus, who is God, became human in order to fully reveal God, God's plan for salvation, and God's love for all people. Jesus gave his life to pay for our sins, God's self-sacrifice so humanity could be reconciled to God. And on Easter, Jesus rose from the dead, defeating death and the grave forever, so that we might have eternal life in God's presence. That is the truth of Christianity, and that is the truth all Christians are called to proclaim, and to live.

When we celebrate Easter, we celebrate the starting point for Christianity: Christ has come; Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

In fact, the reason that Christians gather on Sunday is that it was on a Sunday that Christ was raised, so we commemorate the Resurrection each week.

On Easter, we remind ourselves what we believe, and why we worship on Sunday. *Pastor Frank*
